



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### Tree frog models



## Tree frog construction guide

These three frogs are identical and simple to construct as they are only one piece each

- Cut out the three pieces of the models with a craft knife on a cutting mat (don't let young children do this part). Pay careful attention to the cutting guide (solid black lines) and creases/folds (dashed lines).
- Take the first frog (Piece 1) and carefully crease and fold down the curved lines along the back, then the short curved lines along the throat and belly. Join the slots together, (Slot 1 into Slot 2 and Slot 3 into Slot 4) being careful to tuck the slots inside.


**Key:**

----- crease and fold

- There is a short crease at the bottom of the back. Fold either side of it slightly to angle the back, then fold up the feet so they are level with the table top.
- To make the models look more realistic, curve the nose ends and long hind legs in. See the artist-impression photographs on the colour side of the poster for more details.
