

DJ AMBITION --- EXTRA

Level 2

This level is suitable for students who have been learning English for at least two years and up to three years. It corresponds with the Common European Framework level A2. Suitable for users of TEAM magazine.

SYNOPSIS

Ali Zuri is 16 and lives with her mum and brother in London. She loves urban music and really wants to be a DJ in a London club. She practises DJ-ing all the time, instead of studying, and this causes conflict with her mum. At school, there is a boy called Nik Galas (known as 'Da G') who is already a DJ. He too makes fun of her, saying that girls can't be DJs. He sabotages one of her gigs and makes her look stupid. Ali's only support is her best friend, Kat.

Ali gets a lucky break when she goes to a club in north London, 'The Place' with Kat. She finds out that there's going to be a competition for new DJs. The first prize is a 'residency' at 'Igloo,' a small but trendy London club. By chance, Ali meets Ben Ricci, the owner of 'The Place'. When she tells him how hard it is for her, he suggests that she practises at 'The Place' using the club's excellent equipment. Ali accepts, but finds that Ben's interest in her is more than it seems. Difficulties with Ben and his girlfriend Lisa make it hard for her to focus on her ambition. In the end, though, Ali wins the competition and becomes resident DJ at 'Igloo.'

The main themes are family conflict and sexism.

CULTURAL BACKGROUND

The 'single parent' family set-up, with one parent only is common in the UK.

16 year-olds can legally go to clubs in the UK but they are not able to purchase or drink alcohol. Some clubs operate a strict door policy and won't allow entry to under 18s or under 21s.

Ali and her friends are in year 11 at school. Students take their GCSE exams at the end of the school year. Ali's mum is concerned that Ali isn't devoting enough time to her homework, and revision.

CASUAL LANGUAGE

There are five informal expressions in the story.

- 'Shut up!': This is a very abrupt way of saying 'Be quiet!'
- 'No way!': This is an informal way of saying 'No! Definitely not.' Usually used by teenagers.
- 'Try me': This means 'Tell me give me a chance.'
- 'How's it going?': This means 'How are you?'
- 'In your dreams...!': This means that the previous speaker has suggested something that will never happen.
 Example Da G: I'm going to win, Miz Ali! Ali: In your dreams, Galas!

HOW TO USE YOUR SCHOLASTIC ELT READER

Choosing

Is this the right story for your class? Do they want to read it? If not, choose another! Ask them some questions. For example: Do you like music? What kind of music do you like? Would you like to be a DJ? Do you have a favourite DJ?

Motivating

Get your class to want to read *DJ Ambition*. Motivate them with some background information and a taste of the story, like this: *Ali wants to be a DJ, but sometimes it seems that everyone is against her. Her mother, her brother, 'Da G', a boy at school who think that girls can't be DJs. How will she fulfil her 'DJ Ambition'?*

Organising

Plan a class reading schedule. Decide how many pages to set for reading each week. Select exercises from the back of the reader and photocopy extra activities from this resource sheet to go with each chunk of reading.

Anticipating

Read People and Places on pages 3-4 aloud with the class. Talk about the characters. Ask for predictions. What is going to happen in this story?

Glossary

Go to New Words! on the inside back cover of the reader. Translate the words with the class or get students to find meanings at home.

Casual language

Introduce the informal expressions used in DJ Ambition. Put them into context (see above). Tell students to look out for them as they read.

Book exercises

Show students the self-study exercises on pages 30-32. These are divided into sections. They complete some exercises before they read a section, and some after. (Answers are in this resource sheet.)

Feedback

Have class feedback sessions each week. Talk and ask about the story so far. Get students to ask each other questions. Check exercise answers with the whole class. Answers to all exercises are on page 4 of this resource sheet.

Fact Files

After the story, there are 4 Fact Files. Set these as self-study or use for whole class work. The files explore the themes of the book in a fun and cultural context with interactive elements. Project ideas are on page 4 of this resource sheet.

FACT FILE FOLLOW-UP

THE URBAN SCENE (pages 38-9)

1 Artist profile

Students work in small groups and write profiles of their favourite urban/R&B artists, using the web and magazines to help them. Use the Beyoncé profile on page 40 as a model. Ask each group to read out their profiles to the rest of the class.

2 Music survey

Ask students to do a survey of the most popular kinds of music in their class/year at school. In groups, ask them to prepare questionnaires for their class members to complete. Remind them that the results will be easier to analyse if they provide options for interviewees to tick. Elicit possible question areas. For example:

- Which radio station do you listen to: Radio 1/Radio 2/ Radio 3 etc.?
- What was the last CD that you bought?
- What's your favourite type of music: R&B/classical/opera/ rock/pop etc.?

Students fill in each other's questionnaires. They analyse the results and each group presents their findings to the class. These could take the form of a mock 'radio broadcast,' a magazine article, or a poster.

3 Clothes survey

Students work in groups. They discuss what followers of different types of music typically wear. They then prepare posters, with photos and their own illustrations to reflect their impressions.

THE BAD BOYS OF THE URBAN WORLD (pages 42-3)

1 Personality profile

Who are the other bad boys and bad girls of the music industry? Brainstorm possible candidates with your class. (Suggestions might include Pink, Christina Aguilera, Avril Lavigne etc.) Students then work in pairs. They select a personality who interests them, research their lives and write profiles.

Conduct class feedback on each pair's findings. Ask your class to vote for the worst boy/girl in the music world!

2 Class discussion

'Can the words of songs really start violence on the streets?' Lead a class discussion around this subject. Encourage students to share their experiences and opinions. For homework, ask students to write a 250 word essay on the subject.

DO YOU WANT TO BE A DJ? (pages 44-5) Webquest

Brainstorm other professions in the entertainment industry with your class (e.g. TV presenter, radio DJ, model, pop journalist, actor etc). Students work in pairs. They choose a profession that interests them. Tell them to compile a list of useful websites to help budding DJs / models etc. (Suggestions for searches might include celebrity biographies of those who have made it in their field, training college websites, television network websites etc.)

Groups update the class on websites they have found. Class votes for the top 5 websites based on usefulness of information, presentation etc.
