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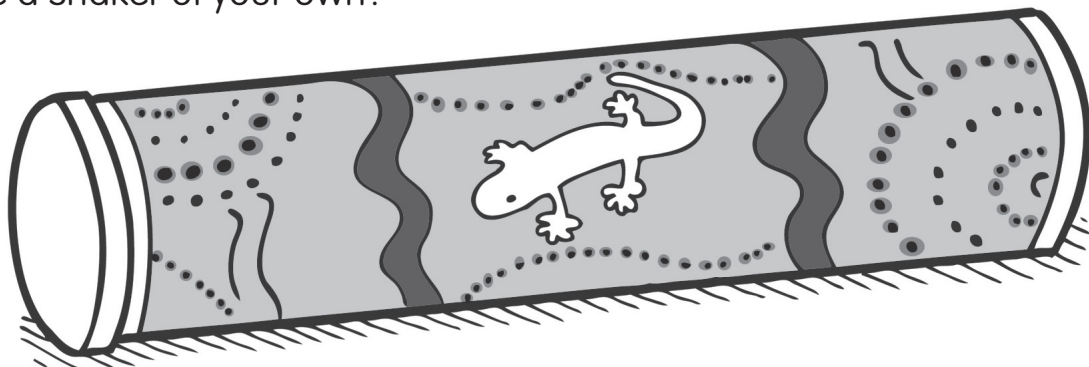
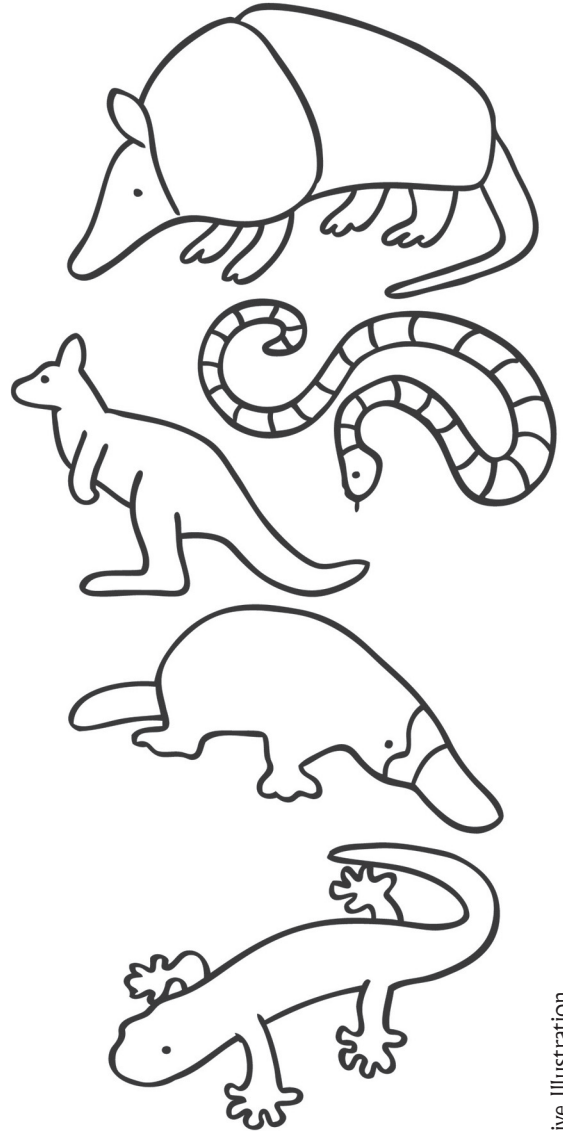
How to make an Aboriginal-style shaker

You will need:

A cylindrical container with lid, dried pulses or rice, plain paper, pencil, ready-mixed paint, glue, cotton buds.

What to do:

- 1 First, fill the container with the dried pulses or rice and then add the lid so that the contents cannot spill out.
 - 2 Next, neatly cover the container in plain paper.
 - 3 Then, draw a very faint outline of an Aboriginal design on the outside of the container.
 - 4 After that, dip the end of a cotton bud into some paint and create a line of small dots on top of the pencil lines. Then fill in the outlines with more dots using different colours.
 - 5 Finally, wait for the paint to dry then play the shaker in time to some Aboriginal music.
