

Word wardrobe

▶ List the different coats you can think of — eg: **overcoat trenchcoat w**



The list includes lots of descriptive compound words. The first part tells us what *type* of coat it is. These are *solid compound words*.

▶ Try the same thing with jacket – eg,
smoking jacket dinner jacket

flak jacket

These are open compound words — but the first word still tells us what type of jacket it is.

Some descriptive words are hyphenated, like **tailor-made** or **T-shirt**. If you're not sure whether to use a hyphen, check in a dictionary.

▶ Picture in your head a special coat. Think of some adjectives to describe it — eq, **an old, white, lab coat**.
